**TUITION: \$ 6,500.00 includes road test**

**DMV FEES: \$ 115.00 (IA permit & license fee)**

**Additional Expenses:** DOT physical/drug screen, TSA HME fee (\$89.50) and DMV history (\$10). Student is responsible for these additional costs and arrangements.

**Financial Aid/Sponsorship Opportunities:** WIA, DOL, DVR.

**Alaska Natives & Native Americans:** Scholarships may be available through one of the recognized tribal organizations around the state.

## 3-Week CDL Driver Training

### Prerequisites:

- Be at least 19 years of age
  - *Effective 11/26/15 you must be 21 years of age to obtain a CDL with Hazmat or Passenger Endorsements. This is a Federal Regulation adopted by the State of Alaska*
- Have a clean driving record (for the past 2 years)
- Provide a DMV full (10 year) driver history (obtained no more than 30 days prior to training)
- Pass a DOT physical (physical is usually valid for 2 years)
  - Federal Law requires medical providers to be on the National Registry to conduct DOT Medical Exams. To see if your provider is on the registry or to find one that is you can go to:

- Pass a DOT drug test through our referral service (cannot be done more than 10 days prior to training start date)
- Provide a copy of AK Driver's license (valid Class D license for a minimum of ONE year)
- Provide a copy of Social Security card
