In order to fully accomplish its primary objective, CEE continuously reviews its method of operations by maintaining ongoing dialog with students, graduates, transportation companies, and regulatory bodies. Although CEE does not provide employment placement, we do capture employment information in the industry from our graduates. Of the 72% that responded they are making an average wage of \$18.83 per hour.

To apply for admittance to CEE, a prospective student must complete an admissions application, provide their 10-year Drivers history, copy of Alaska Drivers License, and be interviewed and recommended by a member of the staff. Prospective students are given a school catalog. Applicants denied admission will be notified in writing of the reason and whether or not they may reapply. Final acceptance of the applicant, after reviewing the enrollment packet, will be made by a school official upon reviewing the student's application and admissions recommendation. Students are admitted and trained regardless of race, age, color, religion, national origin or ancestry, sex, gender, disability, veteran status, genetic information, sexual orientation, or gender identity or expression.
